

"I saw a dead man come back to life today and that makes all these other things seem so small." This was a quote at the end of a TV show where a man who had flatlined then revived to say goodbye to his daughter and new grandson.

Those words were moving to me and they were just lines that were written for a TV show and recited by actors. The story of the resurrection of Jesus is a true story that happened with real people. I wonder if the disciples had a similar thought of "things will never be the same" after seeing the risen Lord.

In studying the book of Acts, I have noticed that the resurrection is the central theme of the first generation church. Jesus presented Himself alive to his disciples and they spoke boldly. (Acts 1:3, 4:31) When they spoke, they "preached in Jesus the resurrection from the dead" and were even arrested. (Acts 4:2) The resurrection along with the power of the Holy Spirit caused the disciples who had run in fear to re-group and preach courageously, most of which gave their lives for the cause of sharing the resurrection of Jesus.

Romans 10:9-10 says that an essential ingredient to salvation is to believe that God has raised Jesus from the dead. Jesus resurrection proves His power over death, being able to promise mankind that by trusting in Jesus, that they can rise from the dead as well.

Resurrection Celebration 2017 begins with a Cross Service on Wednesday, April 12th, at 6:00 PM (In lieu of any other Holy Week services) with an emphasis on the Cross and Jesus' death. The choir will sing and Pastor Mark will give a devotional thought.

On April 16, Village Bible Church will celebrate this resurrection at the **Woodlands Auditorium** for the 24th consecutive year. There will be two services one at 8:30 am and another at 10:30 am. This is a great opportunity to invite guests who might be less likely to attend an event at the church building.

The choir is working to provide great music with two new arrangements written just for our choir, that will help to focus on the celebration of the resurrection. Rebecca Seewald will be singing; and the instrumental ensemble that was with us for the Christmas concert will be playing as well. Pastor Mark Cain will present a message on the topic, "Reclaimed by the Living One." An art exhibit from our local artists, on the same reclaimed theme, using recycled material that has been reclaimed for artistic purposes, will be available for viewing

across the breezeway from the auditorium in the Ouachita room. There will also be cookies served between the services.

Please make every effort to attend, invite, volunteer and enjoy this day. Celebrating Life, because of the resurrection.

2017 MISSION TRIP OPPORTUNITY

Wycliffe Bible Translators Dallas, Texas May 7 - 12



Wycliffe is an international interdenominational non-profit mission organization who for more than 70 years has helped people around the world translate the Bible into their own languages. In 1917 a missionary named William Cameron Townsend went to Guatemala to sell Spanish Bibles. But he was shocked when many people couldn't understand the books. They spoke Cakchiquel, a language without a Bible. Cam believed everyone should understand the Bible, so he started a linguistics school (the Summer Institute of Linguistics, known today as SIL) that trained people to do Bible translation. The work continued to grow, and in 1942 Cam officially founded Wycliffe Bible Translators.

WORK

You can be a short term volunteer selecting from various jobs including office work, painting, boutique work, planting, sewing, or help in the dining room. Lunch is provided.

HOUSING AND FOOD

Wycliffe provides housing, 2 bedrooms a shared living space with a full bath for \$30.00 per person, per day. \$45.00 per day, per person for a single. There is an equipped common kitchen. A full lunch is provided by Wycliffe, breakfast and dinner are not. RV spaces with full hookups are available.





Giving to VBC

Day by day and week after week, the ministry of Village Bible Church continues. The Bible is held high, many are taught, sermons are preached, fellowship is developed, missionaries are supported, and so much more. All of this is made possible by the regular gifts of God's people who count Village Bible Church their church home. About \$79,000 per month is required to keep the lights on and the ministries operating. If you ever have a question about the best place to designate your gift, the general fund is usually a wise choice.

In the past, Congress generally waited until December every year to extend the law that allows people to make a tax free donation of up to \$100,000 from their IRA, leaving some to scramble to make the contribution before the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) deadlines. But Congress made the law permanent last year, so if you're 70½ or older, you can transfer your 2017 (RMD) to charity at any time. If you have questions, be sure to contact the office staff and we'll get you in touch with the right folks.

God continues to bless the ministries of VBC and we are grateful for the long-standing tradition of generosity of our church family. We pray that God would continue to be honored and exalted through the VBC family in 2017, and beyond.

ELDER BOARD REPORT


