





About the Voice of the Martyrs (VOM): VOM is a non-profit inter-denominational Christian organization dedicated to assisting our persecuted family worldwide. VOM was founded in 1967 by Pastor Richard Wurmbrand, who was imprisoned 14 years in communist Romania for his faith in Christ.

VOM's Five Main Purposes:

- To encourage and empower Christians to fulfil the Great Commission in areas of the world where they are persecuted for sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- 7 To provide practical relief and spiritual support to the families of Christian martyrs.
- To equip persecuted Christians to love and win to Christ those who are opposed to the gospel in their part of the world.
- To undertake projects of encouragement, helping believers rebuild their lives and Christian witness in countries where they have formerly suffered oppression.
- To promote the fellowship of all believers by informing the world of the faith and courage of persecuted Christian., thereby inspiring believers to a deeper level of commitment to Christ and involvement in His Great Commission.

Volunteer Opportunities: Short-term volunteers work at the Operations Center doing various tasks. They fold, count, sort, stack, stuff, shrink wrap and sticker just to name a few. This area is clean and climate controlled. Volunteers are seated while they work. There are a few other jobs that require standing and lifting. This is to be determined by the individual volunteer and the work schedule. Short coffee breaks are taken at 10:00 am and 3:00 pm. A one-hour break is taken over the noon hour for lunch.


