A "Sleeper Virtue" For Prayer & Pursuit

Like most of you this past year's election process prodded me to think outside the box. As I was cogitating (= praying and thinking with the Lord intentionally in my mind) it occurred to me that a common theme in the Bible is the danger of pride for leaders.

To give just three biblical examples:

Uzziah was a successful king for God's people. According to 2 Chronicles 26 he reigned for 52 years, "God prospered him," and he was successful in warfare and domestic building programs ... "until he was strong," (2 Chronicles 26:15b). When he became strong his pride became unrestrained and the Lord afflicted him with leprosy till the day of his death.

Nebuchadnezzar acknowledged the deliverance by the one true God for Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego from the fiery furnace (Daniel 3) and was himself "flourishing," (Daniel 4:4). But a year later he forgot. Surveying his city he puffed up "Is this not Babylon the great, which I myself have built ...?" (Daniel 4:30). God afflicted him with madness to eat grass like an animal "until you recognize that the Most High is ruler" (Daniel 4:32). His "reason returned" only when he raised his "eyes toward heaven" and "blessed the Most High ... who lives forever" (Daniel 4:34).

Herod, in Acts 12, accepted the acclamation of the people: "And the people kept crying out, 'The voice of a god and not a man!' And immediately an angel of the Lord struck him because he did not give God the glory, and he was eaten by worms and died" (Acts 12:22-23).

Pride is clearly a common downfall of great leaders (and followers), so would it not be wise to:

- a) Pray for genuine humility for our leaders, and
- b) Pursue genuine humility in our own lives?

True biblical humility, however, is like trying to pick up a wet watermelon seed: just when you think you have it, out it squirts away from you. Don't confuse humility with being uncertain about God's truth. Convictions are good, arrogance is not.

Humility recognizes, "What do you have that you did not receive?" (1 Corinthians 4:7) because God is the Giver of all good gifts (James 1:17). Dwight L. Moody said, "God sends no one away empty except those who are full of themselves." Humility is not denying the gifts in your life, but acknowledging that those gifts come *through* you, not *from* you.

As we enter the New Year let's commit to praying for humility for our leaders – governmental and spiritual – as well as pursue this "shy virtue" in our own lives. The Bible makes some staggering promises: *God gives more grace to the humble* (James 4:6).

"Now That I Am Saved, Where Do I Start?" I'm glad you asked! During the month of January, we are placing special emphasis on what we refer to as the ordinance of baptism. We use the term ordinance because we believe this practice is in direct response to Jesus' command to "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit" (Matt. 28:19, emphasis mine).

There are many views on baptism. Some sprinkle, while others dunk; some baptize infants, others don't; some say baptism is essential for salvation, others disagree. What does the Bible say? Be sure to attend these helpful special sessions led by **Pastor Mike** during the month of January.

BIBLICAL BAPTISM - *Essential for Salvation?* Is baptism essential for salvation? Well, Acts 10 states that some Gentiles were filled with the Holy Spirit (and therefore saved) before they were baptized. This is significant, for the Holy Spirit is the seal of the believer's salvation (Eph. 4:30; 2 Cor. 1:22; Rom. 8:9). Furthermore, Jesus saved the thief on the cross without water baptism (Luke 23:39f). It would seem therefore that baptism is not essential for salvation.

BIBLICAL BAPTISM - *Outward sign of Inward experience*. It is important to recognize that baptism is an outward sign of an inward conversion experience. It identifies us with Christ's death and with hHis resurrection (Rom. 6:1-6,11; Col. 2:11,12). At baptism, the believer symbolically dies to the "old man" to become a "brand new creation" in Christ (2 Cor. 5:17). As an ordinance (like Communion, or the Lord's Supper), baptism is not absolutely necessary for salvation, but it does symbolically declare the Christian as a member of God's visible church. If you would like to explore this matter in greater detail, be sure to attend one of Pastor Mike's classes on baptism during the Bible Study hour in Room 112. If you would like to be baptized, we are planning baptism service on January 29th and would be delighted to assist you in this exciting step of faith and obedience. Simply mark your communication card, or call the church office for additional information.
