

Even I was surprised by the insight and I've been involved in church work my entire adult life. Maybe it was the ringing clarity with which the author expressed it. The title of the book should have been a tip-off: *The Gift of Church*. The Elders are reading through this helpful book together and author Jim Samra makes a compelling *biblical* case that despite all of the negative experiences that can happen, *God has designed and created the local church for our benefit and His glory*. The local church really is His idea and intended by Him to be profitable to our lives – a *gift* for us.

Sweeping the panorama of biblical history, Old Testament and New, when God's people gather, purposefully guided by His will, we are to be experiencing God's presence in a way that can happen nowhere else. This is not to say that you don't experience God's presence at other times and in other ways – you can and hopefully do. But there is nothing comparable to the experienced, "felt presence" of the Living God when we gather "as church."

- 1 Corinthians 3:16 Do you not know that you [plural] are a temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in [among] you [when you assemble as church]?
- 1 Corinthians 14:23-25 Therefore if the whole church assembles together ... and an unbeliever or an ungifted man enters, he is convicted by all ... declaring that God is certainly among you.

Think of the additional dimension that brings to our *Each One Bring One* endeavor. Consider the implications of this for our efforts at REAL Community. You are not merely bringing a person to church. You are providing an assist to scratching the deepest itch of their souls, partnering with the Holy Spirit in helping someone exclaim "Now THIS is what [or rather Who] I was made for!"

Think of all that Thomas missed when he was absent that first Easter evening when Jesus came and stood in the

midst of those assembled and spoke "Peace" to the early followers (John 20:19-24). Graciously, Jesus gave Thomas another opportunity the following week (John 20:26).

A few implications of this for you:

Continue *Each One Bring One* with increased confidence, knowing that you are sharing one of God's great *gifts* for your friends.

You yourself come with increased expectancy of truly experiencing the sensed presence of Jesus every Sunday morning.

The REAL Community that we cultivate has another whole dimension of depth as the presence of Jesus works through the diversity of personalities, temperaments and preferences. I knew a man some years ago who was touting small home churches because he could "self-select" those he enjoyed being with. What a selfish and limiting way to live. The richness of symphonic harmony is so much more beautiful than a single melody line played by three identical instruments. Jesus blesses us with unity, not uniformity, as we mature into valuing the diversity of the body. Now that's REAL Community!

An African proverb says, "If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together." Life is a long-distance marathon. We need to go together. As Pastor Mike regularly reminds us, We Really DO Grow Better, Together.




3 Reasons Why We Should Invite People

ELDER BOARD REPORT

From Baker's Evangelical Dictionary, the word **"FALL"** is widely used to refer to what is recorded in Genesis 3, particularly to what is written of the temptation of Adam and Eve, their being overcome by it, and their immediate reactions after they became aware of the consequences.

In addition, every time I go to a health care provider these days, someone asks me if I have had a **FALL** since the last time I was there. In both cases, there is pain involved with spiritual and physical falls, but this article is about the latter. Following are some thoughts about the risk of falls that happen on slippery surfaces, like a wet bathroom floor or wet asphalt pavement like our VBC parking lot and roads.

And why do physical falls happen to us? We know it is often a lack of foot traction (adhesive friction or force) along with our changing bodies regarding balance, peripheral neuropathy (numbness in our legs and feet), weaker muscles, eyesight, etc. But, we often hear that getting more mature is not for sissies.


So what can we do about reducing this risk? First, our Trustees will help increase the traction on select areas of our sealed asphalt and concrete pavements through applications of rough textured coatings or coverings, and by providing warning signage.

Second, the most important person who can help reduce this risk is the person you see repeatedly in a mirror. When you have been sitting down, stand up for a few seconds, and check your balance. If you know a pavement may be wet, wear grippy rubber soled shoes, and take slow and short "baby" steps, especially in sloped areas.

And lastly, for those driving vehicles on wet VBC parking lots and roads, please SLOW DOWN. That vehicle can hydroplane (skid) on a wet surface, and you can lose control and may injure yourself or hit someone.

So, let's try our best to avoid physical falls and drive safely so we can attend our wonderful church and learn more about that spiritual fall.
