First Christmas - Rediscovering The Awe

I still remember my first Christmas. Well, not my first Christmas *physically*, but my first Christmas *spiritually*. I had become a Christian in November, and although I was eighteen years old physically, I was only weeks old spiritually when December came. The songs, the manger scenes, the Scripture readings were all familiar, but now for the first time "I got it" – or, at least, was *beginning* to "get it." I remember thinking, "So this is what it's really all about!" The experience was like watching an old familiar movie, but for the first time it was now in full color instead of grainy black and white. I was discovering awe.

That was more than four decades ago. I would like to say that every year has continued to be a spiritual high, from one mountain peak to the next. But that would be false. Like you, perhaps, "the old, old story" has occasionally remained ... just old. But I want it to be fresh, new and spiritually enriching this year. Full of awe.

I want to join the magi in rejoicing "exceedingly with great joy" (Matthew 2:10).

Like the shepherds I want to be moved to action by "this thing that has happened which the Lord has made known to us" (Luke 2:15).

I want to be like Mary, "treasur[ing] all these things, pondering them in [my] heart" (Luke 2:19).

In short, I want to *rediscover the awe* of that first Christmas. I want to sincerely echo from the heart, 2 Corinthians 9:15, "Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!"

How can we receive the gift of Jesus afresh, week after week, experiencing His sufficiency for whatever we are facing? Advent can help.

The word *advent* comes from Latin and means *coming*. Historically, the advent season begins the fourth Sunday before Christmas and ends Christmas Eve. This means that, unlike Lent, which is always the 40 days leading to Easter, Advent varies in length. What John the Baptist did for Israel, Advent can do for us – "make ready a people prepared for the Lord" (Luke 1:17). Spiritual preparation.

Starting with our Christmas Concert, December 1, centered on *Jesus*, *The One*, I want to enter in to the Advent season with heart, not body alone.

Our Sunday services will incorporate a brief video that will orient us toward the biblical teaching for the day.

First Christmas - Rediscovering The Awe

Dec. 3 - Advent Week 1 - Mary, Luke 1

Dec. 10 – Advent Week 2 – Joseph, Matthew 1:18-25

Dec. 17 - Advent Week 3 - Innkeeper, Matthew 1; Luke 2

Dec. 24 - Advent Week 4 - Shepherds, Luke 2

Dec. 24 - Christmas Eve - Wise Men, Matthew 2

I like to also remember that *advent* is the root for *adventure*. Advent – some things, such as awe, are too important not to prepare for.

Prepare for the adventure of rediscovering the awe by discovering more of Jesus to you personally this year.


Dear Village Bible Church,

Note: Since the sermons are previously recorded, they will not be heard on the same Sunday as preached at VBC.





VBC END-OF-YEAR GIVING


At Christmas, we celebrate and emulate God's generous and loving pattern by enjoying the tradition of giving to friends and family. In addition, many use the occasion to offer extra gifts to the Lord's work at Village Bible Church. December is usually our largest month in terms of offerings. It's a great blessing and a wonderful way to end the year. The following is some important information as you consider your giving plans for December.

Day by day and week after week, the ministry of Village Bible Church continues. The Bible is held high, many are taught, sermons are preached, fellowship is developed, missionaries are supported, and so much more. All of this is made possible by the regular gifts of God's people who count Village Bible Church their church home. About \$79,000 per week is required to keep the lights on and the ministries operating. If you ever have a question about the best place to designate your gift, the general fund is usually a wise choice.

In the past, Congress generally waited until December every year to extend the law that allows people to make a tax-free donation of up to \$100,000 from their IRA, leaving some to scramble to make the contribution before the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) deadline. But Congress made the law permanent last year, so if you're 70½ or older, you can transfer your 2017 (RMD) to charity at any time. If you have questions, be sure to contact the office staff and we'll get you in touch with the right folks.

God continues to bless the ministries of VBC and we are grateful for the long-standing tradition of generosity of our church family. We pray that God would continue to be honored and exalted through the VBC family in 2018, and
