


From the National Day of Prayer website:

The National Day of Prayer was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. In 1988, the law was unanimously amended by both the House and the Senate and signed into law by President Ronald Reagan on Thursday, May 5th, 1988, designating the first Thursday of May as a day of national prayer. Every president since 1952 has signed a National Day of Prayer proclamation.

Prayer brings people together. Prayer builds bridges between opposing persons and even political parties. Prayer reminds us that we are created in God's image and He desires for us to represent Him everywhere we go. Prayer brings UNITY. In 2018, our theme will be Pray for America - UNITY, based upon Ephesians 4:3 which challenges us to mobilize unified public prayer for America, "Making every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace."

We can get behind this theme as a church since we understand that unity is a value that God loves. Jesus' last prayer from John 17 contains His plea to His father – "that they may all be one; even as You, Father, are in Me and I in You, that they also may be in Us, so that the world may believe that You sent Me."



The day of prayer for our nation is on May 3, but we need to be a people who pray for our nation constantly. So, let's dedicate May as a month of prayer for our country. Unity is a great theme because there is such anger and divide all around us. God

is greater than our issues and He can bring us together but only as we submit to Him. Continue in an attitude of prayer this month for our country to become "one nation under God".

Remember ing Joy Turner One of God's Choice Servants November 30, 1959 – March 12, 2018



When I think of Joy Turner, I think of "joy." Even in difficult times, Joy had a quick smile and an infectious laugh. I remember Joy opening her heart to the Women's group as she told about the challenges she faced in her ministry in Macau. Daily life living in a crowded, hot and spiritually bankrupt city was not an easy task. And yet, Joy loved the people. She loved working with children. She loved teaching English as a way of introducing others to Jesus. She loved her family. She shared how she and her father would have regular video calls and he would always tell her how proud he was of her and the work she was doing. She loved VBC and appreciated the affirmation and encouragement she received from the congregation. Joy was truly a joy to know and will be greatly missed by all who knew her. We grieve her death, but not as those who have no hope. We know that Joy is rejoicing in the presence of our Lord. ~ Jane Cain

Joy Turner was my friend. There aren't many friends who would still love you after they spend hours at Macau Customs because you sent her cat toys with extra bags of catnip...which I never thought would look like something illegal in their little plastic bags! Joy Turner was our Shepherd Group's missionary and we loved her. We had so much fun together and looked forward to the times she visited VBC when in the States. We did keep in touch with her when she was in Macau as well, and so appreciated who she was and the good work she did there. Oh, how we will miss her! ~ Jan McCorquodale

Joy's ever-ready smile attracted me to her when we met at VBC before she first went to Macau. Beneath that smile was a deep love for the Lord and His people and a strong and steady desire to serve Him AND them. She excelled at learning one of the most difficult languages on earth so that she could communicate with 'her people' in Macau. And in her gentle way, led so many, through her teaching English to them, to meet the Savior. I smile. "See you again in Glory, Sweet Friend!"~ JoNancy Sundberg

Joy was a 'joy' to be around. Although I had met her when she came to church to report on her work in Macau, when I went to Macau with 4 others from VBC to teach English as a second language, I was impressed with her energy to work long hours and still have a sense of humor. I saw her through the eyes of one who spent 25 years as a missionary in Zambia. She planned that when our classes were over, each evening, the high school and college students we were teaching took us to different inexpensive restaurants, so we could get a taste of 'their' food and customs. By doing this, the students were also learning how we spoke in various situations. The class fee they were charged was used to pay for their food and ours. There was a minimal fee for taking the course. If a class was given free, the parents would think it wasn't worth taking! I saw that Joy was thoughtful and resourceful. She overheard us saying that we needed to wash some clothes and insisted on taking them to her apartment and doing our laundry in her washing machine. In Macau, all apartments and appliances are very tiny compared to American standards. She invited us there and we saw she was comfortable in the place God chose for her to serve. She had Bible studies in her top-floor apartment and some came to Christ through them. I was aware that a missionary's allowance does not provide for large expenditures, but she insisted on taking the five of us out for a going away dinner. That was so generous of her. On Sunday, when we went to church, everyone was overjoyed to see her. She was loved by the people she served. She definitely had a servant's heart. ~ Jeanette Jones



Each class had an interpreter, so that helped immensely. We were able to share many things from the Bible that pertained to the subject of the day. We enjoyed eating the evening meal with the class. They had lots of laughs at Tom as he always had to ask for a fork as it was not part of the table service. When we were ready at 6 AM at the pier to return to Hong Kong, most of the students showed up to see us off, bearing gifts and pictures for us. Joy said that it was the most she had ever seen for a send-off. Joy loved her Lord and was so faithful in the church planting, teaching, and all the other opportunities she had to serve Him there. Her name, Joy, was so appropriate for her as she brought so much joy to others. ~ Joan Hepburn

To quote a Macau staff member, "The ministry of Evangel Adult Education Center was Joy's passion. She saw it as a beacon of the gospel in this city of over 600,000 souls where less than 2%


