

I suspect each of us have had a time in our life when God used a circumstance to get our attention and teach us a lesson. I have had a number of them. But let me focus on one in this article. It happened in the summer of 1984. We lived in Southern California at the time and were blessed with obtaining several tickets for the Los Angeles summer Olympic games. One event we attended was on the UCLA campus – it was a gymnastics event. A common activity at that venue was people watching.

Ruth and I sat on a bench and observed little conclaves of people from all walks of life carrying on conversations. I noticed a girl standing alone in the middle of one of the wide walkways. She was handing out gospel tracts. Or, at least she was trying to. Many who saw her took a wide berth around in order to avoid contact. Some took the literature from her, looked at it, and promptly tossed it on the ground. Others, more environmentally conscious disposed of the tract in the nearest waste basket. I didn't see anyone take the effort seriously. I remarked to Ruth, "this seems like a terribly wasteful and inefficient way to share Christ. Look at all the people sitting around. It seems to me that she would be wiser to just sit down with those people gathered around and strike up a conversation with them." I had no sooner gotten those words out of my mouth when I saw someone stop, take the tract from her and ask her a question. Then, I realized. She could not speak.

She pulled out a piece of paper and wrote out her response. I was mortified at my own insensitivity and arrogance. Here I was sitting on the sideline, not doing anything but criticizing while she was doing what she could do to share Christ in the best way she could. It was a humbling experience. I came to realize that there are many ways to share the good news of Jesus and we are each called to do what we can.

As the pastoral staff at VBC began to discuss the concept of Eat-Love-Pray last October, I had another humbling experience. I realized I really did not know my neighbors. I couldn't tell you any of their names. So, I decided to change that. Two nights before Halloween, Ruth and I visited several of our neighbors in an effort to hold what we called "reverse" trick or treating. We purchase a few \$10 gift cards from Walmart. Knocking on one door, we greeted a confused looking young man with "trick or treat" and then quickly explained that we were giving out treats, not asking for one. We also apologized that we had not visited them before. His wife came out of the house and met us with deep appreciation for the gift and the introduction. We moved on to several other homes and had a delightful time at each one. Now that the ice has been broken, we are planning to get more deeply engaged with them.

We are looking forward to dining with them and extending our story of God's love for us and our commitment to pray for them. In the coming months I look forward to sharing meals with new friends. But I can do more. I can GOLF-LOVE-PRAY. Mainly we want to connect to new friends in their area of interest so we can fulfil the command to "love your neighbor." Out of that connection will emerge natural opportunities for us to tell our "before, how, now" story. It feels so much better than sitting on the sidelines as a critic.

HIS NAME WAS IN THE BOOK!

When he answered the phone, a young girl's voice pleaded: "Preacher, you don't know me, but my daddy's about to die. Could you please come to the hospital and pray with him? He's not saved."

The young daughter met him in the lobby and led him to her father's room. "His name is Cephas", she said. The old man's face bore the look of a hard life. As the Preacher shared the Gospel, it was apparent his heart was a stone, like the meaning of his name.

Finally, as he was about to leave, the Preacher said, "Did you know that your name is in the Bible?" At this the man opened his eyes. Later his daughter found a Gideon Bible in the

Hot Springs Village Evening Lion's Club Thanks VBC for Faithful Donations of Used Eye Glasses

We commend and thank the Village Bible Church Congregation for your longstanding donations of used eyeglasses which help people around the world have better vision which improves their lives in so many ways. Your box has been one of our best collection points and we invite you to keep bringing your used glasses.

There is also another collection point near your church that is an option. It looks like a mail box in shape but not in color. It has the Lions logo and on top there is a very large picture in the shape of Eye Glasses. It is in front of Sacred Heart on Balearic. We invite you to use that if you wish.

Our Club collects somewhere around 1,200 good pairs of glasses a year after we remove about 40% that are broken or badly scratched. Out of that 40%, those with metal frames are recycled to help with the expenses of running the 13 Lion's collections centers in this country. These centers catalog the glasses by prescription so that missionaries, and other organizations can order them to distribute around the world. We take our used glasses to the Walmart on Central in Hot Springs. Walmart takes them to a collection center. The nearest one is in Midland, Texas. In the U.S. we provide new glasses for those who qualify.

Greetings from Central America!

We recently celebrated 10 years of living and working in Central America! It's hard to believe how quickly 10 years have gone by. Our vision is to work with community members and outreach participants in vocational ministries to see them grow in the likeness of Christ and understand their true calling. Our current ministry site areas are: Tutoring Center, Boys and Girls Club, Creative Arts Workshop (formerly known as the "Wood Shop"), Women's Micro-finance, Community and Environmental Health, and Sports. Our multi-cultural staff work in these sites full time, teaching, discipling and building relationships in the communities; they also incorporate visiting volunteers through study abroad programs and shortterm outreaches. Jeff serves as the director and supervisor for SI-CR. Both Jeff and Tracey teach for the semester study abroad program, mentor staff and enjoy opening our home to our staff and their families, as well as to many other guests.

Dixon Kids

We have 3 children: Olivia, 14, Sawyer, 12, and Lynnea, 8. Our kids will be starting the school year in February. Olivia is a 9th grader. Sawyer and Lynnea (for the first time) will be homeschooling for 7th and 3rd grade, as well as attend a small Christian school 2 days a week. Please **PRAY** for our kids as they continue to navigate friendships and life across cultures. **PRAY** that they would continually grow closer to the Lord and know his heart more deeply. Sawyer will be joining our church's youth group this year; **PRAY** that he would find a niche. All 3 kids have been involved in swimming and will likely start competing this year; **PRAY** that we find a good school/sports/church/ministry/downtime balance.

Staff Update

We are blessed to work with an amazing staff team. **PRAY** that they would draw close to Jesus daily for the strength to serve and minister. **PRAY** that they would have wisdom to counsel and make decisions for their sites. Many of our staff face challenges in their families, marriages, support raising, and health. We also walk alongside people going though very difficult situations of poverty, abuse, sickness, and hopelessness in our ministry sites. **PRAY** for stamina, rest, renewal and vision.

Ministry Site News

Our biggest news is perhaps the purchase of a Creative Arts Workshop (Wood Shop) property!

Through a series of headaches, injustices, waiting, prayer times, and miracles, God provided for SI-CR to be able to buy the property next door to our old Wood Shop. It is bigger and meets more needs than the old property we rented. Our micro-finance site has space to meet there, and they are excited to finally have a "home" after traveling around to the different communities for many years. Our Wood Shop ministry has expanded to include Art and Music, as well as woodworking. Several ladies, as well as youth (mostly young men) have been taking advantage of the classes offered.



Please **PRAY** for this new building (as well as the rest of our sites) and all of the activities that go on there, that God would USE every relationship, every Bible Study, every class, meeting and tool to draw hearts closer to Him.



Our newest site, called Community and Environmental Health, faced challenges just after getting off the ground this past year. This site partners largely with local schools to teach health, nutrition, and creation care, but was thrown off course by nationwide strikes that shut most schools down this fall. Our fearless staff improvised well and were also able to support several of our other sites in the meantime. As public schools (should) start up in February, **PRAY** for a seamless transition back into these relationships and programs, and that our staff will continue to have favor to share the good news freely.

Semester and Outreach Update

This spring we have 5 students for our study abroad program. It's a small group, but we trust that God will move in significant ways in each of these young ladies' hearts this semester. We are also expecting 3 short-term out-reaches this spring, as well as a full summer of 2-week outreaches. In April, we will host the SI Board Meetings here.

Fiscal Reform and Strikes

Last fall, [] passed new fiscal reform laws that cut excessive bonuses and benefits for public employees and will raise taxes on many items and services here. This led to massive protests around the country that (among other things) shut down most schools for several months. This affected all of our ministry sites in some way, because we work with children and families; we also partner with several schools. As the reform starts to take effect, we are not sure what to expect. Please **PRAY** for peace, for schools to open, and for government stability. **PRAY** that SI-CR would continue to be a light and refuge for those that need it.

SI-CR Theme

Our staff theme this year is, "More than we can imagine," based on Paul's prayer in Ephesians 3:14-21. As a family, and as a ministry, we have many, many prayer needs, and we glorify and depend on the God who listens and answers our prayers in ways that exceed all that we can ask or imagine. We appreciate VBC's support through finances and especially through prayer! Thank you for joining us in prayer in 2019!! We know beyond a doubt that the part you play as members of this team is crucial to the expansion of the Kingdom. God is on the move; we are honored to be in this together with you.
